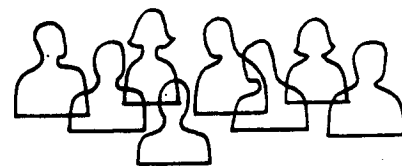
**“Unearthing Christmas” –

**A REMINDER ABOUT PARISH MEETINGS:**

**Whole Community Catechesis-----What is it?**

The Vatican II Council from the 1960’s reiterated that the local parish should be the center for our continued growth in Faith. In an effort to allow as many parishioners as possible to embrace the Scriptures each week and make it their own, the parish’s Christian Formation Committee is offering an easy opportunity to begin this process of Whole Community Catechesis (teaching/learning together as a parish).

Using both the praying community at weekend Mass and the different groupings and committee meetings of the parish throughout the week, we already have a sizable number of the parishioners available to share the good news of the Sunday Scripture readings. The process begins with the “Question of the Week”.

This “Question” will usually be from the Gospel we heard in church on the weekend but it also could come from the other readings. It invites reflection on the message of Jesus and leads into daily life.

At weekend Masses this “Question” will be asked at the end of Liturgy by the Song Leader just before the final hymn is announced. You will also find it printed in the weekly bulletin and on our parish website. This gives an opportunity for everyone to reflect on the Scripture more deeply, individually, or talk about it on the way home or around the dinner table during the rest of the day.

During that week we ask **every** grouping that meets at the parish to begin their session by reading the Scripture, ask the “Question” and then offer the opportunity for those present to give their personal reflection as to what Jesus is saying to them. This should last about 10 minutes. The work of the meeting would begin after that and conclude by asking if anyone has any petitions to be remembered by the whole group in prayer. This time of petition ends with the praying of the Lord’s Prayer together.

This simple process opens up the Scripture to adults and children alike whenever we gather for our parish activities.

In every conference and meeting room, there will be wall box containing the Scripture in English and Spanish and weekly “Questions” for the entire month. Chairpersons or group leaders should use this during the meeting and return it to the box for those who will follow at another time.

May the Lord bring us all to a personal and deeper understanding of His Word through our efforts in teaching, learning and deepening our faith in Him!
