Dear Parishioners,

Happy Easter!

During the Easter Vigil, shrouded in darkness we lit the Paschal Candle to remember the flame of Christ that lights our way. Throughout the fifty days of the Easter Season we celebrate His rising from the dead.

It is so amazing that we celebrate Easter when the Gospel reading from John proclaims that the only thing the disciples witnessed on that morning of the first day of the week was an empty tomb. They gazed into a place of death, a place of darkness. The disciples, Mary of Magdala, John and Peter, did not start their Easter journey with faith – they started with amazement, confusion, disbelief. They started, as John's Gospel said, when it was still dark and all they had and saw was an empty tomb. It wasn't much to go on and not much at all to believe in.

Yet, they did. Jesus simply was not there. Jesus was not dead.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is not just another thing we believe; it is everything. St. Paul says it: "*if Christ has not been raised then our faith is in vain.*" Everything we believe hinges on the resurrection of Christ. The disciples almost missed it. Mary went to the tomb, saw the stone rolled away and left to get Peter and John. They looked in the empty tomb, and went home. If Mary of Magdala had not gone to the place of death, she would never have found life; if Peter and John had stayed home rather than look for the Lord, they would still be wondering about Jesus.

Mary, John, Peter, grew in their faith, in their awareness and in their response. They eventually "*saw and believed*": not Jesus dead, not Jesus not there, but Jesus risen and alive.

We will hear the Easter stories of Jesus again throughout the Easter Season. Some disciples could hardly recognize Him; some couldn't believe it was He; some missed Him. But when Jesus rose from the dead – He stayed risen – He walked among His disciples. Once He appeared, He did not disappear.

During the Easter Season when we sing, "*Jesus Christ is Risen Today,*" we don't mean only "Jesus Christ was raised once upon a time". We don't sing that. We mean that the Risen Christ is all around us, in the eyes and faces of those sitting beside us, in the bread and wine of the altar, in the newly baptized, and in the people we meet all the time.

He is alive today – teaching, healing, touching, suffering, dying and rising. If we go seeking the Risen Jesus with faith and hope and love we will find him in people around us. Then truly not only is Christ risen but we too are already living a risen life by His power and grace.

Alleluia!

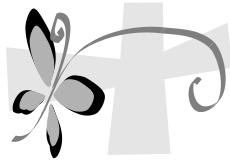

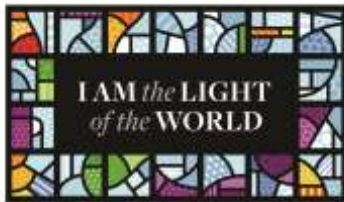

This is Spring Cleaning you can feel good about!**

Here’s how you can help!

Save all your aluminum cans: soda, pet food, soup, tuna, canned vegetables, etc. The best way to check if it is aluminum is to hold a magnet to the can – if it does not stick, it’s aluminum!

Aluminum must be kept separate because it will go into a different container. Every 30 cans of aluminum = \$0.50. If every school family brought just 90 aluminum cans, the School will raise \$500!

**"Why Was
The Roman Missal Revised?"
Part 2 of 2**

Last week we discussed the development of the *Roman Missal* after the Second Vatican Council when the prayers of the liturgy were prayed in the language of the people for the first time. This first Missal was translated in 1969. Since then, many ancient prayers had been found from our early saints and Christian brothers and sisters and were added into a new edition of the Missal. Also, saints canonized since 1969 were added to the liturgical calendar and special prayers were composed for their feast days.

One reason for the revised translation is obviously the additions to the Missal. The second is due to new norms for translating liturgical texts. The document *Liturgiam Authenticam (Fifth Instruction for the Right Implementation of the Constitution on Sacred Liturgy)*, from the Holy See, called for a more literal translation of the Latin texts. A considerable amount of time has been spent trying to accurately translate the Latin texts into English in a literal manner.

After approving the revised English translation of the *Roman Missal*, the English-speaking bishops' conferences (representing 11 countries) sent to texts to Rome for review. Once reviewed, the translation was "recognized" and given approval (*recognitio*) to publish. The text was then set to publishers for the pain-staking task of type setting the texts and chants before sending them back to their country's bishops for final approval. This process has been going on for more than 10 years because of the enormous amount of text and music involved. The final editions are in the publishing process and parishes are able to receive them in October.

NFP is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid pregnancies. NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP can enrich the bond between husband and wife.
