Dear Parishioners,

Quite a few of you have inquired about what is still needed to complete the New Chapel and Conference area in the Holy Angels Church building. The basics: walls, ceilings, lighting, heating and air conditioning are near completion. But the monies for the outfitting of the new space is still needed.

Some particular things that are needed are an 18 cubic ft. refrigerator for that space, at a cost of about \$700. In the Conference Room we are in need of monies for tables, chairs, and a white board for the wall, all costing a total of about \$1000. And finally, the cost of carpeting the whole area for materials is \$7000.

“The Liturgy of the Word”

Although evidence is meager, there is good reason to believe that the proclamation of God’s word sometimes took place in conjunction with the early celebration of the Eucharist. The documents attesting to the fact are few, but of considerable weight. Apostolic writings were read at Christian assemblies, and it is likely that at least some of these gatherings were for celebrations of the Eucharist. There is also evidence (Acts 20:7-8) to suggest that instruction and explanation took place at the Eucharistic meal.

And yet it was only subsequent to the separation of the Eucharist from the meal that a more formal scripture service developed, whose structure may have been somewhat influenced by the morning prayer service held at the Jewish synagogue. Although the Liturgies of the Word and Eucharist were often celebrated independently of each other, their general fusion seems to have occurred in the east by the early sixth century and in the west later.

The Scriptures were primitively read in a semi-continuous manner: the Lector read the whole book from beginning to end although certain verses or chapters were omitted. But with the development of the liturgical year, a system of fixed and related readings was gradually established to highlight particular feasts or seasons and to give thematic unity to the readings.
