From the Pastor's Desk

Advent is a season of waiting, preparation, hope and prayer. It is also the beginning of a new year in the Church's liturgical calendar. Advent looks to the future – the Second Coming of Christ; it also looks to the past – the first coming of Jesus at Christmas.

As folks living in the fast-paced twenty-first century we generally don't like waiting; many of us are not good at it. We like fast results and we like to get where we're going. That's why Christmas comes earlier and earlier – we decorate, we shop, we have luncheons and bazaars, all to help us celebrate Christmas because we can't wait. Doing nothing but waiting before December 25th is not an option for us. How about putting prayer into the Advent equation this year?

St. John-Holy Angels Parish offers several unique prayer experiences during the Season of Advent. Each week there are opportunities for daily Mass, Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer as well as Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Daily Mass is offered every day from Monday through Saturday at St. John Church at 8:00 AM. Exposition and Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament is celebrated every Friday from 8:30 AM through 12:30 PM.

Advent Prayer is celebrated every week. **Morning Prayer** and **Evening Prayer** in the days prior to Vatican Council II were called Lauds and Vespers. The Church celebrated Lauds and Vespers as prayer in community. Even though the names of these prayers have changed, they give us the same opportunity to offer praise and thanks to God in our **Morning** and **Evening Prayer**.

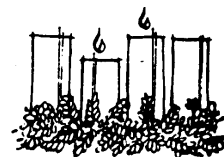
The Parish offers **Morning Prayer** at Holy Angels Church on December 16th and 22nd with the Holy Angels School Community at 10:00 AM.

New Hymnals

You will notice that our *Breaking Bread* hymnals have been replaced to coincide with the new liturgical year. These hymnals are "sacramentals"; we use them to worship, praise and glorify God. They draw us closer to God and his grace. We ask that you please notice that these hymnals must last for 12 months, and they are easily damaged; the hymnals are also very costly. To keep our hymnals looking beautiful throughout the year, we ask that you please return your hymnal to the location in which you found it, and that you are certain to not bend the pages or covers when putting them back in the chairs or pews. Also, please do not leave them on the floor, or on the seats of the pews or chairs. Thank you!

Advent Worship Aids

This year, due to rising publishing and printing costs, we are trying to be more economical and reduce costs. Instead of printing an entire booklet for the Season of Advent, we printed a small Worship Aid which contains our parish's favorite Advent hymns which are not found in our *Breaking Bread* hymnals. Throughout the Advent season, please take a blue Worship Aid found in a basket at the entrance of the church. Please do not fold, bend or roll up the paper. After Mass, return it to the same basket so that they can be used for other liturgies. If you see extra Worship Aids lying around after Mass, we would ask that you please help by picking them up in order to keep our churches looking beautiful!
