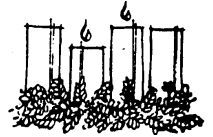

**True or False?**

..... **from The National Study of Youth and Religion**

The Catholic Church, in comparison to other religious traditions, was equal to or better in most variables measuring religiosity.

**False.** Catholic teens scored 5-25 percentage points lower than their conservative, mainline, and black Protestant peers on many of a variety of religious beliefs, practices, experiences, commitments, and evaluations.

According to Dr. Smith, “Compared to the official Catholic norms of faithfulness and to other types of Christian teens in the United States, contemporary U.S. Catholic youth are faring rather badly. On most measures or religious faith, beliefs, and practices, Catholic teens as a whole show up fairly weak. We think this can be attributed to a number of causes...Catholic teenagers today merely reflect the leading edge of a larger trend.”

**Advent Vespers:  
Our Parish's "Best Kept Secret"**

One type of prayer that is always offered in our parish during the Advent Season is Vespers, which is part of the Liturgy of the Hours. Many parishioners have yet to experience this very moving type of prayer, making it our "best kept secret". The Christians of the early Church devoted themselves to prayer at fixed times. Over time, it became practice to assign special times for common prayer; for example, the final hours of the day when night looms and the lamps are lit (Vespers). Vespers consists of hymns, psalms, prayers and Scripture, followed by a reflection, led by a priest, deacon, or trained lay presider. Just like the early Christians, the Church encourages us to pray at these times as a community.

Vespers will be celebrated on December 5<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM at St. John The Baptist Church. Vespers will be celebrated on December 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> at Holy Angels Church at 6:30 PM. **Parish group leaders were sent invitations to have their group join the parish in prayer on one of these nights; group leaders are asked to continue to encourage attendance on your selected evening.** If you enjoy quiet and contemplative type prayer, please join us. This is a wonderful opportunity for each of us to slow down during this hectic, busy season and pray. Come see what the "best kept secret" is all about!
