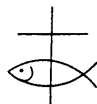

*Lent*

**To Fast** means to eat only one full meal during that day. The other two meals should be smaller than the main meal. Also, no eating between meals. All persons ages 21 – 59 must fast on the required days.

**To Abstain** means to refrain from eating meat on the appointed day.

All persons over the age of fourteen must abstain on required days.

**Days of Fasting & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday**

**Days of Abstinence: All Fridays of Lent**
