We believe that Sacramental Worship is the source and summit of our Christian life, and that worshipping Jesus in union with the Father and the Holy Spirit is our highest calling.

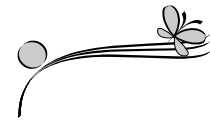
We believe that God's creation is sacred and beautiful. We accept the responsibility to be stewards of all that God has entrusted to us, especially the gift of life itself.

Liturgy Corner

"Back Seat Catholics"

"Why do we fill up the seats in church from the back to the front?"

Maybe it's piety: We sit in the back because, aware of our many failings, we don't feel worthy to draw near.

Maybe it's culture: We sit in the back because our mothers taught us never to claim the best seats or make ourselves the center of attention.

Maybe it's selfish: We want to be able to skip out early.

Whatever the reason, it causes a practical problem: The front seats are always empty, creating a "gap" between the Lord's Table and the Lord's people. And latecomers stand in the back rather than march up to the front where everyone can see that they're late.

Let's show some hospitality here! Let's fill the church up from the front to the back, leaving the back rows for those who come later or late.

Filling in the front seats first isn't proud or arrogant. It's part of the ministry of hospitality that all of us who are baptized are called to exercise. It's a simple act of kindness that helps the Church to gather better around our Lord, so that we may give God thanks and praise.

This Fall, from **September 22 through October 31**, more than 32 states will unite for the largest simultaneous pro-life mobilization in history – the nationwide **40 Days for Life** campaign.

40 Days for Life began in 2004 in a small evangelical faith community in Texas. It has spread to more than 150 cities throughout the nation, to Christians of every denomination. The **40 Days for Life** campaign is made up of three key components:

- **Prayer and Fasting:** people of all faiths join together for 40 days of fervent prayer and fasting for an end to abortion.
- **Peaceful Vigil:** participants stand for life through a 40-day witness outside the Planned Parenthood facility at 625 N. Shipley St. in Wilmington.
- **Community Outreach:** a positive pro-life message is delivered to every corner of our city through media efforts, church presentations, petition drives, and public visibility.

How can you help? We need one church or organization for each day of this event – 40 churches or organizations for 40 days. Each will be a prayerful **WITNESS FOR LIFE** for the unborn and their parents.
