Dear Parishioners,

Quite a few of you have inquired about what is still needed to complete the New Chapel and Conference area in the Holy Angels Church building. The basics: walls, ceilings, lighting, heating and air conditioning are near completion. But the monies for the outfitting of the new space is yet to be donated.

Some particular things that are needed are a microwave for the kitchenette and an 18 cubic ft. refrigerator for that space, totaling about \$1000 for both appliances. In the Conference Room we are in need of monies for tables, chairs, a flat screen 50 inch TV and a white board for the wall, all costing a total of about \$2000. In the chapel we are still in need of a 50 in. flat screen TV for the wall. And finally, the cost of carpeting the whole area for materials is \$7000.

Any help you might be able to give toward the completion of this much needed added space at Holy Angels is most appreciated. Please call the Parish Office, 731-2200, for more information.

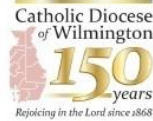

As part of the Diocese of Wilmington’s 150th anniversary celebration, a pilgrimage to Annecy, Rome and Assisi will take place April 16 – 26, 2018. And you are invited!

Annecy, the birthplace of Saint Francis de Sales, patron saint of the Diocese of Wilmington, is an alpine town in southeastern France, where Lake Annecy feeds into the Thiou River. It’s known for its cobbled streets, winding canals, and pastel-colored houses. Rome, Italy’s capital, is a sprawling, cosmopolitan city with nearly 3,000 years of globally influential art, architecture and culture on display, including ancient ruins such as the Forum and the Colosseum. It is the home of Vatican City, headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church, St. Peter’s Basilica and the Vatican Museums, as well as the burial place of Blessed Pope Pius IX, the diocese’s founder. Assisi is a hill town in central Italy’s Umbria region. It was the birthplace of St. Francis, one of Italy’s patron saints.

“Entrance Procession”

Once the Church began to celebrate the Eucharist within large buildings, it was natural to utilize the space these structures provided. Most probably some type of formal entrance into the Basilica already existed by the fourth century. An expansion of this action eventually occurred. Since the sacristy was located close to the entrance of the major churches in Rome, the Pope, accompanied by a large crowd of ministers, entered the church from the sacristy and solemnly processed from the churches door to the altar. The precise period when this solemn entrance developed is not known; it is attested for the Papal Mass shortly after 701 A.D. Just before the various ministers entered the church, an acolyte solemnly carried in the book containing the book of the gospel passages. Outside Rome, where there were fewer ministers, the procession was more modest. But as the Mass was gradually linked to the Liturgy of the Hours for which the clergy were already assembled, sacristies came to be located in proximity to the sanctuary. Consequently, the procession was generally abbreviated or fell into complete disuse. Today it has been restored, usually with the priest and ministers processing from the rear of the church. Thus, the procession, together with its accompanying song, is a sign of the self-identity of both the ministers and the people. (c) 2011 Lawrence Johnson

Important information for Low-Income Families

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a USDA, federally-funded program administered by states that operates during the summer months when school is not in session. The SFSP was established to ensure that low-income children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session. Free meals, that meet Federal nutrition guidelines, are provided to all children, 18 years old and under, at approved SFSP sites in areas with significant concentrations of low-income children. 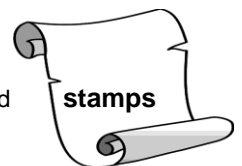
Food Collection Donations

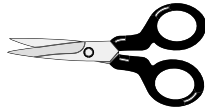
Do You Have a School Bond?

San Mateo impulsa a sus oyentes, a los de entonces y a los de hoy, entregarse con sigilosa pasión al Evangelio. Pero esa entrega debe ser tan sigilosa como alegre. Una vida sin alegría no vale la pena, por muy "cristiana" que parezca. En resumen y como el papa Francisco nos ha recordado, sin alegría no hay Evangelio.
