Liturgy Corner

The Roman Missal – Last of a 7-Part Series

“How will we learn these new prayers and responses when the new Missal is finally implemented?”

At the present time, there is much work underway to prepare materials for assisting clergy, diocesan and parish leaders in implementing the revised Missal in parishes.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is collaborating with a number of organizations who are developing both training workshops as well as parish implementation kits that can be used to introduce these changes at the local level. Between April and November of 2010, a series of workshops are being offered in various regions throughout the US to begin “training the trainers.” This same approach will then be used in the Diocese of Wilmington as we roll out the training to parish leaders. A training program will be available to parish leaders in the late summer or early fall from our diocese. Publishers are also developing materials to assist in this formation process but there is limited information available at this time. As plans and materials take concrete shape, we will continue to communicate that information to our parish family. Plans will also be communicated here in the parish bulletin.

These changes probably won't take effect until Nov. 2011. But they're coming! And it's time to prepare. For more information, visit www.usccb.org/romanmissal/.
