St. John Cemetery

Did you know that St. John-Holy Angels Parish has its own cemetery? If you didn’t, you are not alone. Possibly because we don’t often speak of it, and because of its geographical separation from the main parish campus, many parishioners are not aware it exists. Not only do we have one, but it has been a part of our parish since 1885. In 1885, Justin J. Pié, a parishioner and owner of the Deer Park Estate, donated an acre of land for a parish cemetery, located at 401 Elkton Road at the corner of Elkton Road and West Park Place. The cemetery was officially opened in 1892 and is still in use today. There are over 200 interments dating from 1892 and as recent as this year. If you drive by the corner of West Park and Elkton Road, you will notice a Historical Marker adjacent to the Cemetery Gate, identifying the grave of Major League Baseball Hall of Fame Member Victor G. Willis. And when you drive by, remember to say a prayer for all those buried here, and all the souls of the faithful departed.

Football Camps

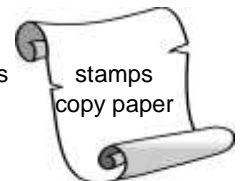

Delaware Legislature Determined to Repeal 10 Commandments: Catholics Outraged

In a late-session flurry of activity, some Delaware Lawmakers are finding time to promote Bills particularly damaging to life and liberty in the first state.

Senate Bill 5 (SB5), which has passed the senate and is now in house committee hearings would code into Delaware law all of the mistakes made by the Supreme Court in the Roe V Wade and related decisions made in 1973. It would allow abortions right up to delivery and prevent parental notifications, stripping any safeguards that still exist. The reason is given that the current state law is unconstitutional. We think the real reason is that there is fear that the Supreme Court might actually have a burst of common sense soon.

SB65, which is out of committee, will make it illegal for any medical professional to treat minors with therapy known as "conversion" therapy in the event they lean toward same sex attraction or gender confusion. It would also prevent these same Psychiatrists or Psychologists from referring such a minor for treatment out of state. So parents wanting to take some treatment actions would become pretty much out of luck. The reason given is that this type of therapy doesn't work.

HB160, currently in House Committee hearings, is a bill allowing Physician Assisted Suicide in Delaware. Dressed up as "death with dignity", the bill finds a way to overlook the billions of people in history who have died with dignity at a time and place ordained by their God.

It is not clear what Delaware's Catholic Governor will do if these bills make their way to his desk for signature. So please pray for him, that he will do the right thing and not sign these bills into law if they pass the Legislature. Please make your voices heard, and put your Faith into action. We need you, please, to:

- 1) Pray fervently for these bills to be defeated in Delaware, since they will be voted on next week.
- 2) Call your DE Representative in Dover to vote "NO" on all three bills listed above. It is imperative that they hear from you, their constituents, please.

Recall that just a few years ago, Delaware was one of the few states which was successful in defeating the legalization of human embryonic stem cell research!

So working with God, through prayers, sacrifice, and fasting, we can see God's victory again, though we need ALL of YOU to help, please.
