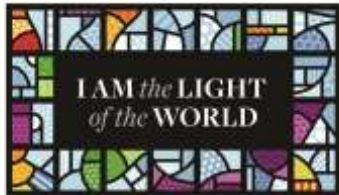

**“Making Cents Out Of Going Green!”
This is Spring Cleaning you can feel good about!**

Here's how you can help!

Save all your aluminum cans: soda, pet food, soup, tuna, canned vegetables, etc. The best way to check if it is aluminum is to hold a magnet to the can – if it does not stick, it's aluminum!

Aluminum must be kept separate because it will go into a different container. Every 30 cans of aluminum = \$0.50. If every school family brought just 90 aluminum cans, the School will raise \$500!

All other cans and scrap metal will be deposited into another container together. We will accept any metal items, including but not limited to: old lawnmowers (empty out gas/oil), washers, dryers, weights and weight benches, filing cabinets, metal desks, folding metal chairs, metal lawn furniture and tables (without glass), aluminum siding, all scrap metal, copper, iron, brass, steel, stainless steel, and even car batteries.
