### Roman Missal Update

*What will the new Missal mean in our parish?*

In the months before the revised translation is implemented, parishes in the United States, and in all English-speaking countries will have to do many things. We will have to replace liturgical books and participation aids. Priests, deacons, and lay presiders will practice proclaiming the new texts and will prepare homilies helping the faithful to understand the new translation and to deepen their appreciation for the liturgy. The music ministers (cantor, choir, organists, etc.) will soon learn new musical settings for the parts of the Mass (such as the *Gloria* and the *Holy, Holy*), and they, in turn, will teach the Assembly these new parts. Catechists and teachers will help parishioners learn the new prayers. Parishes are also using the opportunity to undertake a serious reexamination of their liturgical practices to determine their strengths and areas of need.
