

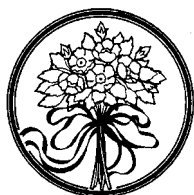

Dear St. John-Holy Angels Families,

Thank you so much for your wonderful donations of clothing and baby items to **A Door of Hope**. Let me give you some examples of how some of these items are used.

- A woman was referred to us by a domestic violence social worker. She was staying at a hotel with her two daughters. All their clothes and baby items had been left behind. The baby was just a month old. We were able to provide the client with a large bag of things for the baby, toiletries for the mother, and a portable bassinet. We gave her a Bible and prayed with her. She was thrilled and grateful to God.
- A woman can choose individual pregnancy/parenting classes or faith classes to earn credits for items that she needs for her baby. These classes range from your first trimester information, labor and delivery instruction, newborn care, and breast feeding to toilet training!
- Many women continue to come in and take classes for diapers and clothing as their baby grows.

Your gifts make our ministry possible and we thank God that we can work together with you to provide for others.

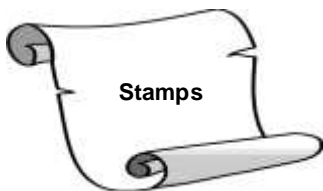

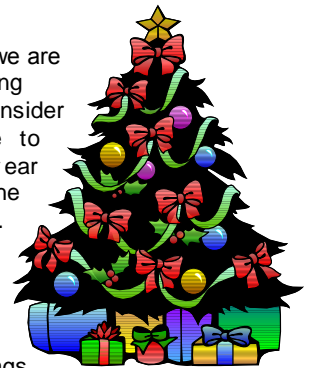

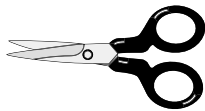
"I was hungry and you fed me." Matthew 25:35
