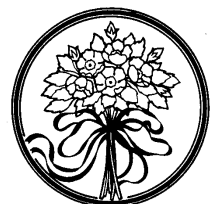

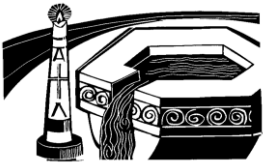

“The baptismal font is to be located near the entrance of the worship

*space because the Sacrament of Baptism is the **gateway of the sacramental life** of Christians. It is located in proximity to the Altar—the Table of the Eucharist—as a reminder that we must pass through the waters of baptism and the community of the Church to come to the Table of the Eucharist.”*

Sadly, there will be no baptismal font at Holy Angels until funds are raised for a new, permanent structure. We are currently completing the design and structural phase of the project and hope to have a goal set soon. 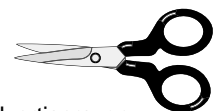
