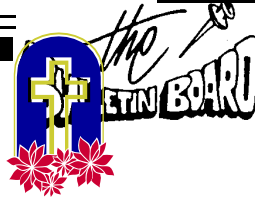

**Suggestions on what to do**  
during private **Eucharistic Adoration**

1. **Pray**  
Praise God, give thanks, ask for forgiveness, seek answers, pray for others.
2. **Recite the "Jesus Prayer"**  
Say "Lord Jesus, have mercy on me, a sinner", repeatedly as you quiet your head and mind.
3. **Meditate using Scripture**  
Choose a passage from the Bible. Read the words and ask God to let the passage speak to you. Pay special attention to anything that strikes you and ask God what He wishes for you to draw from that passage.
4. **Pray the Rosary**
5. **Pour out your heart to Jesus and adore Him.**  
Speak to Jesus, aware that you are in His presence and tell Him all that comes to your mind. Listen for His response. Pray the prayer that St. Francis instructed his brothers to pray whenever they were before the Blessed Sacrament: "I adore you, O Christ, present here and in all the churches of the world, for by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."
6. **Sit quietly and just "be" in the presence of God.**  
Think of a visit to the Blessed Sacrament as coming to see your best friend. Sit quietly and enjoy being in each other's company. Instead of talking to the Lord, try listening to what He wants to tell you.

**New Parkinson's Support Group**

Rabbi David Kaplan, who recently retired from Temple Beth El in Newark, has organized a support group for people with Parkinson's Disease (PD). Rabbi Kaplan was diagnosed with PD in June, 2006. He is attempting to reach the people who have PD, which is sometimes difficult because, as he once thought, they often feel that they do not need a support group. People with PD often feel they have lost control of their lives.

Moving Ahead with Parkinson's (MAP), a monthly forum for people with PD, is an opportunity to find ways of regaining some of that control. The format will vary from month to month. Topics will include keeping up to date on ways to cope with PD and learning methods for functioning better, as well as providing a place for those who wish to share their feelings, frustrations and successes in connection with PD. The first meeting of MAP will be held at the Newark Senior Center from 2:00 PM – 3:00 PM on Thursday, October 7.
