THE ASSEMBLY’S MASS RESPONSES & PRAYERS

GREETING

Priest chants or says:

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

or:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

or:

The Lord be with you.

Assembly chants or says:

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL ACT (A)

All: I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have *greatly* sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,

And, striking their breast, they say: through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault;

Then they continue:

therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

THE GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest,
and on Earth peace to people of good will.
*We praise you, we bless you,
we adore you, we glorify you,
we give you thanks for your great glory,
Lord God, heavenly King,
O God, almighty Father.
Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son,
Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,
you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us;
you take away the sins of the world,
receive our prayer;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father,

Assembly: *Glory to you, O Lord.*

THE NICENE CREED

*I believe in one God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and Earth,
of all things visible and invisible.*

*I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God,
born of the Father before all ages.
God from God, Light from Light,

Assembly chants or says:

And with your spirit.

Priest:

Lift up your hearts.

Assembly: We lift them up to the Lord.

Priest:

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Assembly: *It is right and just.*

THE HOLY (SANCTUS)

All: *Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts.
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.*

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

THE MYSTERY OF FAITH

Priest chants or says:

The mystery of faith.

Assembly:

*We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your
Resurrection until you come again.*

or:

*When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup,
we proclaim your death, O Lord,
until you come again.*

or:

*Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross
and Resurrection you have set us free.*

BEFORE THE SIGN OF PEACE

Priest:

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

Assembly:

And with your spirit.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Priest:

*Behold the Lamb of God,
behold him who takes away the sins of the world.
Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.*

All:

*Lord, I am not worthy
that you should enter under my roof,
but only say the word
and my soul shall be healed.*
