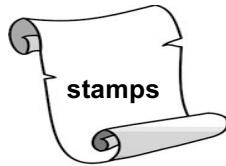

### HERE IS HOW YOU CAN HELP:

Save all your aluminum cans: soda, pet food, soup, tuna, canned vegetables, etc. The best way to check if it is aluminum is to hold a magnet to the can: if it does not stick, it is aluminum!

Aluminum must be kept separate because it will go into a different container.

All other cans and scrap metal will be deposited into another container together.

We will accept any metal items including but not limited to: old lawnmowers (empty out gas/oil), washers, dryers, weights and weight benches, filing cabinets, metal desks, folding metal chairs, metal lawn furniture & tables without glass, aluminum siding, all scrap metal, copper, iron, brass, steel, stainless steel, and even car batteries.

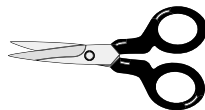
