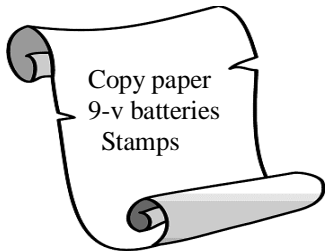

Roman Missal Update

Last weekend, the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Cardinal Francis George, Archbishop of Chicago, announced that "the full text of the English-language translation of the Roman Missal, Third Edition, has been issued for the dioceses of the United States of America."

From the time Pope Benedict accepted the texts last spring, until last week, the Vatican was approving adaptations that the United States had requested to make the texts more relevant to the faithful in our country.

The Missal will be implemented in late 2011 on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27. Our Director of Liturgy & Music, Stephen Adams, spent this summer at various workshops and seminars on the revised Missal and can now move forward in the parish with our important catechetical efforts as we prepare the text for implementation.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is the act of worshipping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood," Catholics have believed that the bread and wine are no longer baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity. Spending time before the Blessed Sacrament, in prayer and devotion, is exactly the same as spending time before the living God.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

The devotion begins with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. A Priest or Deacon removes the sacred host from the tabernacle and places it on the altar for adoration. The purpose of adoration is to highlight the presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist. A consecrated host is placed in the Monstrance. (Monstrance: sacred vessel used for Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.)
