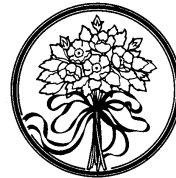

## Prevention Health Screenings

Wednesday, February 10<sup>th</sup>

### Holy Angels Parish Center

**Did you know...** 2 of 3 stroke victims have no prior symptoms or warnings! And your doctor cannot order an ultrasound test unless you do have symptoms.

**Prevention Health Screenings** has been coming to our parish for the last 6 years, and will be here again on Wednesday, February 10<sup>th</sup>. They will be offering 6 screenings that could save your life - and they don't hurt! These screenings identify risks for heart disease, stroke and osteoporosis.

Last year, almost 50 parishioners were tested, and some of you found that you were at risk! Test results are mailed to you, and you follow up with your own doctor.

#### Tests offered are:

##### 1. Stroke/Carotid Artery Screen:

The number-one cause of stroke is linked to carotid artery blockage. 11 parishioners tested in 2009 were at mild risk, and 1 was in the severe category.

##### 2. Atrial Fibrillation Heart Rhythm Screen:

This test is new this year, and is a partial EKG screening that detects atrial fibrillation, a common heart arrhythmia, which increases the risk of stroke 5 times.

##### 3. Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screen:

Ultrasound is used to visualize the aortic artery in the abdomen. Last winter, 2 of the 44 persons tested here had an aneurysm.

##### 4. Peripheral Vascular Disease Screen:

Two parishioners last year had abnormal test results from this screening. People affected with this have a six-to-seven times greater risk for heart attack and stroke.

##### 5. Osteoporosis Screen:

Ultrasound measures for low bone mass in the heel bone. This screening helps to detect the disease before a serious fracture may occur. 22 parishioners had this screening; 7 parishioners were found to be at high risk.

##### 6. Pulmonary Function Screen:

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease is a lung disease characterized by irreversible airflow limitation in your lungs. Of the 21 parishioners who took this test, 12 had abnormal results.

**Cost:** Tests 1, 2, 3, & 4 cost \$129.

Tests 1, 2, 3, 4, and your choice of 5 or 6 is \$149.

All 6 Tests cost \$159.

### Voice of the Assembly

The primary instrument for the liturgy is not the organ or the piano or the guitar but the voice of the assembly. In fact, the singing assembly is the most beautiful sound that the liturgy can make. When it is authentic and resounding, it is the only measure of whether our music is prayer or not. Nothing ever quite matches the full, alive sound of the whole congregation joining together in the praise of God. The word that best describes that event is "Alleluia." Alleluia is a Hebrew word that translates "God's people praise God." This special song of praise is used at many different times and in many different ways, but it is especially at the time immediately before the proclamation of the Gospel that it becomes an acclamation, a kind of shout for joy—always joyful, always sung. As the assembly, our job is to be witnesses to our faith to one another through our singing, and encourage others to do the same through our enthusiastic song. Singing together is an important element of the liturgy which transforms us from independent individuals to a unified worshiping body. If we choose not to sing because we feel we do not sing well, we can always remember that Psalm 95 invites us to make a "joyful noise" in our praise of God no matter the quality of our voice! God wants to hear us all!
