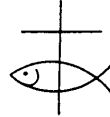
### Time Change Next Weekend

**To Fast** means to eat only one full meal during that day. The other two meals should be smaller than the main meal. Also, no eating between meals. All persons ages 21 – 59 must fast on the required days.

**To Abstain** means to refrain from eating meat on the appointed day. All persons over the age of fourteen must abstain on required days.

## The Gospel of John

After Easter we will begin to study the Gospel of John. Unlike the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke), where we see more of the humanity of Jesus, in John, Jesus is a majestic figure, in control of his destiny at all times. John has a very black and white version of the world. The narrative can even be harsh and abrasive at times.

The Little Rock Scripture Series commentary helps us to be provoked, challenged and enlightened by the "deceptively simple" but "irony-laden" words and actions of the Gospel's characters.

We will break the study into 2 segments, Spring 2013 and Fall 2013. The Spring session begins Monday, April 8 and ends Monday, June 10. We will meet every Monday, except for Memorial Day, in Holy Angels Church Conference Room from 7:00 – 8:30 PM. There is a \$20 registration fee to cover class materials. ### New Summer Mass Schedule for Holy Angels

The St. John-Holy Angels Parish Liturgy Committee has recommended that the parish move to a summer schedule through Labor Day weekend.

The Diocese recommends that if the church is less than 50% filled for Masses, the parish should examine the Mass schedule. Holy Angels Church seats 800. During the summer months, the 9:00 AM Mass averages 150-200 and the 11:00 AM Mass averages 200-250.

The recommendation to make this change is in line with what many other parishes in the Diocese of Wilmington do during the summer months when a majority of the population takes vacation. The change will also help with liturgy staffing issues.

**Beginning Sunday, July 7 and ending Labor Day Weekend, August 31/September 1, there will be only one Mass on Sunday morning at Holy Angels, at 10:30 AM. There will still be a Saturday evening Mass at 5:00 PM.**

The St. John schedule of Masses at 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM will not change.

## Baked Bread

As a wag has said, it's easier to believe that bread really becomes the body of Christ than it is to believe that the host is really bread.

The bread of the Eucharist traditionally takes the form of hosts, but some Catholic communities bake their own communion bread. The practice fulfills an instruction for the Mass that the bread "must be recently made" and "that the material for the Eucharistic Celebration truly have the appearance of food" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal* 320, 321). Authenticity for this most central sign requires that the bread look like genuine food to be broken and shared by the faithful.

Baked bread makes the symbolic connection to the food of the Last Supper. Jesus took the ordinary substances of his dinner table and transformed them into his own body and blood. When the bread offered at Mass more nearly resembles ordinary bread, the full impact of the miracle sinks in. The eternal Son of God becomes truly present to us under the form of the simplest of substances.

Baked bread allows a local community to offer its own gifts for the Eucharist. It also permits a more dignified ritual of breaking the bread during the Lamb of God. The early church referred to the Eucharist as "the breaking of the bread" to stress readiness for sacrifice and the unity of the faithful.

According to the tradition of the Roman Catholic Church, Eucharistic bread is unleavened, made from wheat flour and water. When baked by the local community, care should be taken that the bread not be underdone nor baked too hard. If reserved in the tabernacle after Mass, it should be consumed before spoiling or turning brittle.
