**Here's how you can help!**

**Save all your aluminum cans:** soda, pet food, soup, tuna, canned vegetables, etc. The best way to check if it is aluminum is to hold a magnet to the can – if it does not stick, it's aluminum!

Aluminum must be kept separate because it will go into a different container. Every 30 cans of aluminum = \$0.50. If every school family brought just 90 aluminum cans, the School will raise \$500!

**All other cans and scrap metal** will be deposited into another container together. We will accept any metal items, including but not limited to: old lawnmowers (empty out gas/oil), washers, dryers, weights and weight benches, filing cabinets, metal desks, folding metal chairs, metal lawn furniture and tables (without glass), aluminum siding, all scrap metal, copper, iron, brass, steel, stainless steel, and even car batteries.

**Roman Missal Update**

**"What is different about the revised translation?"**



Blessed Pope John Paul II issued the third edition of the *Roman Missal* in 2000. This new edition included many new texts in Latin that required translation. In addition, the experience of the Second Vatican Council gave rise to a desire to a more formal and literal translation of the original Latin texts. This new translation will employ the best of what we've learned about translation and liturgical language in two generations of celebrating the liturgy in the vernacular (or language of the people).

The style of translation of the third edition is different. In accord with the rules for translation established by the Vatican, the revised translation follows the style of the original Latin texts more closely, including concrete images, repetition, parallelisms, and rhythm. The English used in the Mass texts will now be more formal and dignified in style. Where possible, the texts follow the language of Scripture that we hear often.

In addition, the third edition contains prayers for the celebration of recently canonized or beatified saints, additional prefaces to the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Masses and prayers and revised instructions for the celebration of the Mass.

One criticism is that the new language of the Mass is very poetic and at times does not follow the "street" language of the people that we use every day. However, shouldn't our "liturgical" language be different than the language we use every day? Shouldn't we speak to our God, our creator, our sustainer, the one who listens to us and answers our prayers in a formal, liturgical, and "different" way than we talk to our friends and family members we see each day?
